## Subcontractors score a win with this legislation

HR 2232, aptly named the Make Every Small Business Count Act of 2013, is now an amendment to the National Defense Authorization Act of 2014. President Obama recently signed this change into law, and it will likely become effective in about 18 months.

The act will permit prime contractors that are covered by a subcontracting plan pertaining to a single contract with a federal agency to receive credit against such a plan if they use small-business subcontractors at any level of subcontracting.

Previously, prime contractors were only allowed to count first-tier small business subcontractors toward the goals.

The new law encourages them to make sure small businesses have opportunities for growth.

In other words, if you are a small-business sub and are self-certified for federal work, you could potentially benefit by the increase in tiers to which subcontractor participation can be counted toward the prime's goals.

This new law is a significant win for the entire industry and for subs in particular.
